FUNDING FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL PE and SPORTS 2014/2015

The government is providing an extra £150 million of annual funding for the academic years of 2014/2015 and 2015/2016. The aim of this funding is to improve the Physical Education (PE) and Sports programmes offered by primary schools, and is provided jointly by various governmental departments, including Education, Health and Culture, and Media and Sport. Although the funding will be allocated to primary school head teachers, it will be 'ring fenced' – this means that it can only be spent specifically on PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, though how they do this remains their decision.

This is how Woodcocks' Well CE Primary School has used the funding in 2014/2015:

- Hiring specialist qualified sports coaches to work with pupils whilst providing PE coaching for staff
- Purchasing quality resources to support the delivery of school sports clubs and P.E lessons

For the academic year 2014/2015 Woodcocks' Well CE Primary School was allocated £8400 of sports funding. Below you will find a full breakdown of how the sports funding has been allocated and the impact of this.

Dance / Gymnastics Specialist Tuition	£ 990	<u>Impact of PE Funding:</u> All pupils enjoyed the full breadth of the PE Curriculum, led by specialist teacher. The coaching generated enthusiasm amongst the children and staff in this curriculum area. Developing ball skills has been identified as a priority across the school. The additional apparatus purchased has made football and netball available for junior games and opportunities for children to practice these ball skills both during PE lessons and playtimes. After school clubs have been able to go ahead making best use of the outdoor pitch/court.
