FUNDING FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL PE and SPORTS 2015/2016

The government is providing an extra £150 million of annual funding for the academic years of 2014/2015 and 2015/2016. The aim of this funding is to improve the Physical Education (PE) and Sports programmes offered by primary schools, and is provided jointly by various governmental departments, including Education, Health and Culture, and Media and Sport. Although the funding will be allocated to primary school head teachers, it will be 'ring fenced' – this means that it can only be spent specifically on PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, though how they do this remains their decision.

This is how Woodcocks' Well CE Primary School has used the funding in 2015/2016:

- · Hiring specialist qualified sports coaches to work with pupils whilst providing PE coaching for staff
- · Purchasing quality resources to support the delivery of school sports clubs and P.E lessons
- Introduction of a multi-surface outdoor court for use during PE and playtimes.

For the academic year 2015/2016 Woodcocks' Well CE Primary School was allocated £8425 of sports funding. Below you will find a full breakdown of how the sports funding has been allocated and the impact of this.
