Below is a list of websites that can be used during this period of home learning. Some are free to use for the time being and others are free all the time. Each website has various resources ranging from Maths and English to Science and PE. Some of the websites on the list are for the children to play games and others are a combination of learning activities and games. The suitability of websites for different year groups is noted in the website descriptions.

Reception and Year 1

Phonics Play - Currently free to use (username: march20, password: home). Allows access to different games for the children to practise their phonic knowledge. <https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/>

Read with Phonics - Free to use when you create an account. This is a fantastic resource for children to practise their phonics as well as applying their skills to reading. It is very interactive and can be played on a tablet or on the computer.
