Organisers can choose to either sign up online at [trusselltrust.org/tea](http://trusselltrust.org/tea) to support the work of the Trust's central organisation, or can hold an event in the name of Newcastle-Staffs Foodbank and gift the money raised locally.

Tea for Trussell takes place from June 21 to July 4 so there is plenty of time to think about your cake and dessert menu, choose your venue, and send out the invites.

Events such as charity dinners were permitted from May 17

under the roadmap out of lockdown set out by the Government.

A spokesman for the Trussell Trust said: "Tea for Trussell offers a wonderful opportunity for our supporters to catch up with friends and family, colleagues or their wider community and raise money and awareness to help end the need for food banks in the UK. It's so simple.

"They just invite friends and family, make a brew and have a great time."

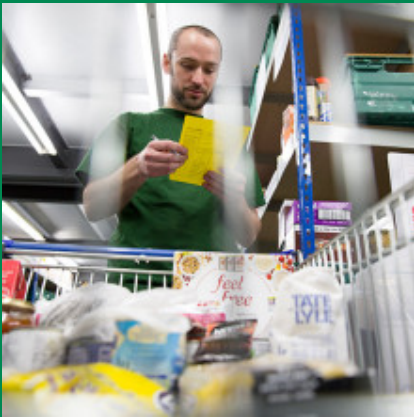
